The President's Shack

The Club faces a major decision this month. The markets have been brutal, and that has resulted in our earnings fund, at the ARRL for our annual Scholarship, getting depleted. Our endowment is intact – and that is a good thing! That being said our revenue fund is depleted. This brings us to the question as to the feasibility of awarding a scholarship for 2023. This decision is before the membership at the April general meeting.

We have three options before us. First, Suspend the awarding of the Scholarship for 2023. This will allow our revenue fund at the ARRL to recover and thereby maintain the endowment in its entirety. Second, award the Scholarship by making up the shortfall utilizing current Club finds. Third, Award the Scholarship by dipping into the endowment.

It is my opinion, as President of the Club, that we consider the fiscally responsible option and strive to maintain the endowment in its entirety for the future. It is the legacy the WARAC leaves behind. In keeping with this the Board agreed to recommend suspending the Scholarship for 2023 with further evaluation taking place later in the year. It is my hope that the markets recover and thereby the fund does too.

This is your club and your vote does matter!

The month of May will feature the Trunk-to-Trunk mini swap fest. Bring your trunk full of your stuff and take back another trunk full of stuff. The activity will be held before the meeting. Stay tuned for details. Also, June (in addition to Brides) features Field Day. The Club will sponsor its annual one-day field day activity at D.J. Mackie Picnic Area in Waukesha County. Come join the Club bring and see how prepared you are to make a few QSOs under unusual conditions. It is usually a good time!

Held our monthly meeting on April 6th. Getting through the hemming and hawing part, Bill D discussed the tracking protocol used by the QRP-Labs folks. Their website hosts a number of existing balloons which anyone can check out at https://qrp-labs.com/tracking.html.

The tracking for W9FK-1 will be via 20 meter WSPR. The tracker uses a channelized approach which is selectable via programming. Bill is working out the nuances and is just itching to get a solar cell in his hands.

Solar cells will consist of three 6 or 7 cell units packaged in a foam pyramid. This is a well documented and proven approach. MJ needs to get a couple of fabricated cells over to Bill.

That's about it for this month. The project moves ahead at a glacial pace. I guess some months we get a little more melting than snowing. Lets see how we do next month.

Icom IC-905: How about the new Icom super VHF/UHF/SHF all everything radio? Presented the information from the ARRL on the ARRL Scholarship Fund current status. The Fund did not have a 4% or greater return in the market last year to support awarding a scholarship in 2023. (The Bonds and Market "50/50" had a negative return.)

Options presented.

- 1. Do not award a Scholarship this year.
- 2. The Club comes up with the \$3K to award a Scholarship. -Where does the Club get the money?
- 3. The ARRL recommended, reduce the scholarship to \$2K for the future. Based on normal market returns.


After discussion, the Board recommended to present to the membership for a vote, the following. "To suspend awarding the scholarship for this year, and re-evaluate the for the future."



Motion Regarding Funding the David Knauss Memorial Scholarship for 2023

In accordance with the Club's By-Laws for prior notification and for membership approval pertaining to extraordinary expenditures, the following motion is being presented at the April 11th Monthly Meeting for a vote by the membership:

DISCUSSION: On or about December 31st each year the ARRL Foundation reviews the 'Earnings Account' for each endowed scholarship. If the amount of money in the earnings account is larger than the scholarship grant amount, then the scholarship will be funded via the endowment. If the amount is less than the grant amount, the scholarship sponsor is given the opportunity to directly provide the grant amount to fund the scholarship. If the sponsor does not provide the grant amount, then the scholarship will not be issued for that year.

On December 31, 2022, the ARRL Foundation found that our 'Earnings Account' was \$625.49 negative. This means that the Foundation will not be able to fund the 2023 scholarship, and they have asked if WARAC wants to provide the \$3,000 amount, or another amount, in order to fund the 2023 scholarship. They need WARAC's response by April 12th, 2023.

MOTION: Should WARAC provide an additional \$3,000 to the ARRL Foundation to fund the 2023 David Knaus Scholarship?

WARAC Board Recommendation: The WARAC Board held a special meeting to discuss this, and voted to NOT provide \$3,000 for the 2023 scholarship.



2023 April Notes

Well March was as difficult a month as I've seen. One activation. One. I snuck it in with no notice way back early on. The park of choice was Valley View in New Berlin. That is such a nice park, particularly given the close proximity of the parking lot to the trees. The elevation is very high as well so propagation is a no brainer.

The day was not great. In fact it was cold, which could describe all the Wednesdays in March. I went to the usual park shelter just south of the tennis courts. I was literally the only car maneuvering for parking spots. I was anxious to try out a new antenna that I'd been working on. I've got a new Spark Plug 9:1 with a counterpoise lug coming out and I needed to wind it up to see how it played. I have not used a 9:1 in years so my experience with them is on the low side. I was really looking forward to putting 30 meters in the rotation with the usual 20 and 40 meter bands. That was the plan.

As it turned out, about the only thing that went well was 20 meter CW. I managed the usual 20 meter harvest of 10 QSO's in the CWops 1900 CWT. The antenna deployment actually went pretty well, but setting the antenna was kind of rough. My sling arm is not up to mid-season form, that's for sure. I was also using 41' of wire for the antenna and 15' for the counterpoise. I picked up an autotuner from China Inc over the winter and it worked very well. A bit of a battery hog, but it tuned up on all bands. I was feeling pretty good before Murphy popped up.

The re-emergence of sunspots, while generally great news, has really smacked daytime 40 meters. 40 just ain't what it used to be and I could not dredge up so much as one contact. I think it is more the situation where 40 is still producing near-in contacts, but everyone is having way too much fun on 15 and 10 meters. Unfortunately my Mountain Topper doesn't have those bands available. Ah well.

No worries, this is where 30 meter FT8 will come to the rescue. And I'm sure it would, except the QDX FT8 QRP rig needs a USB cable to connect to the computer. It really helps if you remember to bring one along. Just as well, I also managed to lose my GPS dongle so getting a time sync would have been very difficult. So no 30 meter FT8 for me.

Fear not, there is always another Wednesday. I will post on Facebook if/when I manage to go out again. It will probably be the morning of so there won't be much forewarning.
