
This year we will be holding both fundraisers at the New Berlin Sendik's 3600 South Moorland Road New Berlin, WI 53151

Has built-in CW decoder thats "pretty good." You can also send CW via the keyboard. The over the air audio is reported to be excellent.




## **DX UPDATE:**

### **FreeDMR**

As a companion to last month's article regarding alternative DMR networks I thought to highlight another network you may not have heard about. FreeDMR (http://www.freedmr.uk/) is a UK based network that offers its services to the worldwide DMR/Digital community. It's operation is slightly different than BrandMeister or TGIF but it also offers a bit of flexibility to the end user who is looking to have or operate with their own identified TalkGroup (TG). That's right, you can break free of the existing TG structures which are primarily geographically organized and secondarily subject oriented. You can have your own!! Well, sort off. I should point out that there are no FreeDMR repeaters, at least not in our region, so access will be via hotspots only.

The operation of FreeDMR is very similar to the DMR+ network. You basically engage a TG via a private call and then switch to TG 9 to converse on that TG. As with TGIF, you can only open one TG at a time so you can't stack them up like you can with BrandMeister. Switching TG's is just a matter of entering another one. No disconnect is required. Naturally, they offer the standard list of geographically designated TG's and don't you know that Wisconsin is labeled with the familiar 3155. That's a tip of the hat to us well trained BM guys. To access the network you can either engage FreeDMR on your pi-star network list or you can setup rewrite rules via DMRGateway. As with DMR+, there is really no reason to engage code plug changes, as you can just manually enter the TG you want to go to. Bada Bing, Bada Boom.

Nothing above is crazy exotic and is frankly de rigueur for all our familiar DMR network haunts. But the FreeDMR folks allow a little bit of TG flexibility to the end user that the other networks typically do not. Follow me on this one: The BM network allows for sub-talk groups to be created from the main channel. So for Wisconsin 3155, on BM there are sub Wisconsin TG's like 31550 and 31555 for instance. Well on FreeDMR, the user can just key up and activate any non-listed sub TG exactly as if it were listed. So for FreeDMR Wisconsin TG 3155, you can activate 315501, 315502 ... just by placing a Private Call to that TG. Oh and by the way, you can do exactly the same thing with you DMR ID#. Just activate it via a Private Call and switch to TG 9 to converse.

So why do this? Well, maybe you want to have a weekly net or some other organized get together for your group, club or organization. It is a capability that just maybe you might find useful. Who knows. BTW there are some limitations to this feature. The TG you create will not be permanent and will deactivate after a short time if it is unused. The created TG will also not show up as active on any of the lists of websites that track the network activity.

Give FreeDMR a try. If nothing else it is another avenue to explore. The FreeDMR website has a number of howto's and FAQ's to help you out. I found them to be very useful and friendly to the average DMR user.




