

Stars and Stripes Honor Flight (SSHF) will host 187 veterans when it takes off this Saturday, November 2. This flight, on two chartered Delta aircraft, will take the veterans on a one day free trip to Washington, DC to see their memorials. This is the 20th Honor Flight mission out of Milwaukee. To date, 2,896 veterans have taken a Stars and Stripes Honor Flight since its inception in the fall of 2008.

Some interesting facts about the veterans on Saturday's flight:

- 187 vets ranging from 76 -96 years old
- 45 WWII; 142 Korean Veterans
- 2 female veterans, both from WWII

Stars and Stripes Honor Flight opened up its application process to Korean War veterans this year and the response has been overwhelming.

There is currently a wait list of more than 700 Korean War veterans. "Because we have such a long wait list now of Korean War veterans, we decided to make our final flight of the year a double flight, " says Paula Nelson, President of Stars and Stripes Honor Flight. "We have two planes on Saturday, so that one flight can have a Korean War memorial focus for the 142 Korean War veterans traveling with us. We will continue to fly WWII veterans as soon as they sign up."

In addition to the veterans and guardians, Stars and Stripes Honor Flight will also be taking a middle school student from Cedarburg's Webster Transitional School on the trip. Mikayla Wankowski is the co-winner of an essay contest for middle and high school students. The students were tasked with researching a veteran from WWII or the Korean War who is buried at Arlington National Cemetery. Mikayla will be condensing her research down to a eulogy which she will deliver on Saturday during the stop at Arlington. The other co-winner, Ellie Huffman from University School, will fly in the spring on the next Stars and Stripes Honor Flight.
