

### **GENERAL COMMENTS**

Band conditions. Bad weather. Exciting year. High level of activity. Lower scores. No new records. Electronic logs better and worse.

### BAND CONDITIONS

John, our Wisconsin single operator winner says it this way - " more difficult conditions this year, with 40 going so long so fast, and then 80 much the same. The last hour was awful with only 45 Qs compared to our other 6 hours averaging about 90. Maybe, just maybe, however, the conditions might lend themselves to allowing a northern mobile to rise above the handicap of traveling in fewer and larger counties. By carefully planning the location of the start, the finish, and a couple of side trips, we managed to hit 17 counties - up from 11 last year. Exceptional driving and navigation by W0TVD made this possible. A snowplow had taken out the Douglas County sign, so we missed it, and only made 10 Qs in that, our last county - missing the bonus ". Pete, our out-of-state single operator winner says it this way - " totals slightly down this year over last, but I learned my lesson and emphasized CW over phone. " Other station comments described it differently - Harry, PA3ARM, from the Netherlands, says he had to give up early this year due to very weak signals, while Vollie, W4TDB (TN), says 40 meters was rocking - Joe, W3AG (PA) said his QRP signal was heard by all, even on 40 SSB, while Anthony, N3GE (Washington DC) thought signals to the mid Atlantic region were very poor - Loyd, VE7FCO (BC) thought band conditions were poor, while Ron, N9AU (Milwaukee, WI) worked many out of state stations on multiple bands - Bruce, AA9RN (Sheboygan, WI) thought he was talking to himself most of the afternoon, Keith, KS9WI (DePere, WI) thought propagation was lousy, while Jim, K0HW (SD) mentioned great conditions from his QTH on 40 phone while not being able to be heard on 20 phone or CW. Band conditions played a part in our March 12, 2006 WIQP.

### BAD WEATHER

Mark, WA0MHJ, operating under the Minnesota Wireless Association club sign W0AA, who came from Ham Lake, MN, to Wisconsin to operate, was happy that the nasty weather kept to the south for a change, while Paul, K9OT, (Shullsburg, WI), in the SW corner of Wisconsin, said he had to disconnect very early due to a thunderstorm that went thru. Jacob, W9BLI (Luxemburg, WI) thought the bands were not in very good shape possibly due to the storm. Doug, W9WI (TN) said " too much QRN, " as did Larry, K0LWV (MO) who put it this way " QRN rough from storms." I know in Waterford, where I live (SE WI), it was 38 and sunny at 10 AM, during WIQP there was heavy static, and when WIQP ended at 7 PM and I checked the radar, I saw lots of red and yellow blotches denoting heavy weather moving thru, with its included high static levels, so I know WX played a part in 2006 WIQP.

### EXCITING YEAR

This year we had two new single operators who never won WIQP before, find the formula to put themselves in the best single operators winners seat, the highest level possible, and of course, earn a nice plaque for each of them, which I am sure they will display proudly.

### HIGH LEVEL OF ACTIVITY

We received 240 logs this year, which while not a record, is just 8 logs less than our all time high. 125 of those were electronic. We had all 72 Wisconsin counties, all 50 states and 11 of our Canadian Provinces show up in the logs (no LAB or NWT were found). When I started entering the data from the logs into our database, I was rather surprised. After just six logs entered, I had already seen 67 of 72 WI counties, and 32



states. After log number 18, I had 72 counties and 48 states. By log 58 I had all 50 states. Only N9KI, the Bay Area Wireless multi-multi station, worked all 50 states - and they had 68 counties, the highest number for any station. From out-of-state, K9EU (IL) managed to work 65 counties. I found 46 mobile/portable callsigns in the electronic logs, of which 38 submitted entries. We had 14 Minnesota Wireless Association members participate in WIQP, five of them operating mobile from within Wisconsin. Collectively, the 14 scored 547,413 points, all on our behalf, which put 3256 total Qs in others logs, 2776 CW and 480 phone. I sure thank them for that effort. I also need to mention W9YV, who operated as a multi-multi fixed station, but somehow managed to forget to send their entry in until the last week in May. As a check log, they did a bang up job, with 363 CW Qs, 350 phone Qs, and 101 multipliers for a final score of 163,014, certainly one of the best check logs I have seen in my 20 years of doing the WIQP data. I want to thank them for their efforts on our behalf also.

Mobile activity was good too. We had 36 WI mobiles enter, 27 as single operator (8 of those were Single Operator Technicians that operated mobile), 5 as multi op and 4 as multi-multi op. Collectively they put 1,189,337 points in other participant's logs, consisting of 8,196 total Qs - 5,274 CW and 2,922 on phone. Eldon, W1END (NH) commented " thanks to the mobiles, things went by fast. " Joel, NA4K (TN) said our " good sho wing from the mobiles made this fun. " Don, W0EAR (portable WI) said " thanks to the mobiles, as I worked some of them several times in different counties. " Pete, K2PS (NJ) worked mobiles N0IJ for 14 Qs, NN9K for 12 Qs, W9HB for 11 Qs, W9MSE for 10 Qs, W0ZQ for 10 Qs, NE9U for 9 Qs, N9NE for 9 Qs, N0UR for 8 Qs, AF9T for 8 Qs and WI9WI for 5 Qs.

This year our 240 entries consisted of 145 from within Wisconsin and 95 outside. We had 3 Canadian Provinces enter, and DX entries from Bulgaria, Italy, the Netherlands and Portugal. Within Wisconsin we had 88 entries in our Single Operator Fixed category, 19 in the Single Operator Mobile category, 15 in the Single Operator Technician category, 11 in the Multi Operator Fixed category, 5 in the Multi Operator Mobile category, 2 in the Multi Operator Multi Transmitter Fixed category, 4 in the Multi Operator Multi Transmitter Mobile category, and 1 in the Multi Operator Technician category. No entries were received for the Single Operator Novice category. Out-of-state we had entries from 32 states. In our Single Operator WI top ten scores, we found 5 fixed entries and 5 mobile entries - first was NOIJ mobile (who came from Duluth), second was W0EAR fixed portable (who came from MN to operate from Burnett County), third was WA9TZE fixed, fourth was W9XT fixed, fifth was N9NE mobile, sixth was KB9OWD fixed, seventh was NN9K mobile (who came from Colona IL), eighth was W9MSE mobile, ninth was N0UR mobile (who came from NW of the twin cities in MN) and tenth was W9LO. Certainly high fixed and mobile activity was a part in 2006 WIQP.

### LOWER SCORES - NO NEW RECORDS

Perhaps it is because we are in the near or at the bottom of the sun spot cycle, or perhaps due to the weather this year, some other item, or a combination of items, upon reviewing this years scores against past years, I definitely see lower scores. As a result, there were no new records set in our standing records list.

### ELECTRONIC LOGS

We did have some problems this year. First, we had an email log submission address problem. We changed our email address this year. We did not follow thru and change the "other address" we have as part of the electronic log submission information on our website. As a result, when people tried to submit to the "other address," they were rejected. We apologize for that error. Second, we got a number of entries without



complete information on them, such as no address included, no log included with the entry (just a summary sheet), multiple operator entries without all the names and callsigns included, power level unknown, etc. We find that interesting. We think that tells us we need to do a better job with the information we have on our website for log submission. We are going to do a complete rewrite of that information, to make it easier to understand. That should help a lot, not only with information missing, but also with the total information we need to process logs. Third, we continue to find a wide variation on the format that electronic logs use. It would be nice if all the logging programs were similar, so we do not have to spend so much time trying to get our computer to import the logs. We would hope that we can fix that too. Fourth, dupes. We find a lot of logs contain dupes. While we understand that the big contest sponsors allow that, perhaps because they have contest scoring software, it causes us a lot of time spent eliminating those dupes. Perhaps we could ask that entries be gone over before being submitted to eliminate those dupes ? Fifth. We got a lot of repeat emails this year asking if a log had been received. It would sure be nice if we could find a sort of contest robot, like other big contest sponsors have. Any suggestions ?

Lastly, we continue to do beta testing on electronic entries. This year we think we got a good number of better logs than in past years, allowing for the comments above. It is so nice to be able to receive the email, separate off the header leaving just the log, then save the log as a text file, import that text file into our spreadsheet and process the log. That way we can verify the claimed score versus what we actually find in the log, including all the associated data we need for our results information on our website each year. To that end, we are going to try and expand the information that we hope gets included in our "header" included with the log. If we can get that in place, with all the information we need for a complete entry included in the header, it is possible that we can eliminate the dupe sheet. Perhaps that will lead to eliminating the need for a summary sheet too.

### RESULTS

For the fourth time in a row, a single operator mobile station, using CW only, won the 2006 WIQP WI plaque, and also for the fourth time in a row, the same club won our WI Club Competition plaque. We had 27 clubs enter this year.

The 2006 plaque for the highest scoring Single Operator in Wisconsin goes to all CW entry John Baumgarten, NOIJ, from Duluth, MN. John's mobile traveled through 17 Wisconsin counties, doing 581 total Qs, with 65 multipliers and 8,000 bonus points, for a total of 121,295 points. He contacted 28 counties, 35 states and 2 Provinces in his journey. John has never won, although he has been a participant for many years. John is a member of the Minnesota Wireless Association radio group. Enjoy your plaque John, you earned it.

The 2006 plaque for the Wisconsin Club Competition goes to Fond du Lac Amateur Radio Club. If there is a word like fourpeat, it belongs to them. They had 19 stations enter this year, producing a total point value of 466,739 points. Congratulations to all of you who are members of FDARC.

The 2006 plaque for the highest scoring Single Operator outside of Wisconsin goes to Pete Stafford, K2PS, who lives in NJ. This is Pete's first win in WIQP to the best of my knowledge. Pete did 166 CW Qs and 21 phone Qs with 58 WI counties, for his 30,711 total point win. Congratulations Pete.



The Single Operator Fixed category, our most popular, was won by Don Strom, W0EAR, who traveled from Shoreview, MN, to Burnett County in Wisconsin to operate. Don made 221 CW Qs and 291 phone Qs with 40 counties, 48 states and 4 Canadian Provinces, a total of 100 multipliers. His final score totals 110,450 points. Congratulations Don.

The Single Operator Technician category produced a surprise this year. We had TWO stations with the exact same score. Brian Long, KB9LRD, did 209 phone Qs with 16 counties, and one state, for a total score of 10329.5, traveling thru 10 counties. Adam Sprangers, KC9EKV, did the exact same thing, except he traveled thru 11 counties. Since they have equal scores, we will award a dual first/second place certificate to each of them. Congratulations to Brian and Adam.

The Multi Operator Fixed category was won by N9BC. They had 294 phone Qs, 69 CW Qs, with 40 counties, 44 states and 6 Canadian Provinces, for a total score of 38,880 points. Congratulations to Brent Crier, N9BC, and Gregg Seidl, K9KL.

The Multi Operator Mobile category was won by NE9U. They did a 16 county trip, making 544 CW Qs and 25 phone Qs. Their 23 county, 37 state and 2 Canadian Provinces produced a total score of 111,509. Congratulations to Scott Jasper, NE9U, and Allan Schlaugat, N9ISN.

The Multi Operator Technician category was won by K9AIH. They did 50 phone Qs with 9 counties and 2 states for a total of 825 points. Congratulations to Darrell Schreiner, K9AIH, and Christian Lantz, W9CDL.

The Multi Operator Multi Transmitter Fixed category winning entry was from the Bay Area Wireless Association, using their N9KI callsign. Their 7 operators made 448 CW Qs and 683 phone Qs with 68 counties, 50 states and 5 Canadian Provinces. Total score was 291,325.5 points. Congratulations to Tom Hellem, K0SN, James Mans, AA9PB, Dwight Bosselman, W9YQ, David Cunningham, NS9R, Jeffrey Reymer, KE9S, James Callow, K8IR, and Paul Sorensen, KC8YZB.

The Multi Operator Multi Transmitter Mobile category was won by W9HB, who traveled to Wisconsin from Elgin, IL. Their 558 CW Qs and 8 phone Qs, while traveling thru 17 counties, contacting 31 counties, 35 states and 2 Canadian Provinces, produced a score of 123,148 points. Congratulations to Harold Burt, W9HB, and Roger Scott, KF9D.

### 2007 WIQP

We continue to wait for the FCC to make their move with the amateur radio licensing structure. When that happens, WIQP will look at their new structure and react accordingly. Watch for possible changes. We will try to get the word out as soon as we can after those changes.

### THANKS

Many, many, many times over the past 20 years, I have said that without all the people who participate in WIQP each year, there would be no WIQP. This year is no exception. Whatever we are doing right is a testament to all of you helping us make WIQP better each year. West Allis RAC continues to stand proud, in this our 27th year of sponsorship of WIQP. We are thankful for all the logs we get each year, as well as the multitude of callsigns we see in the logs each year, many of whom do not send entries to us. We think WIQP is best QSO party going. We know you agree. Seven short hours of fun, excitement and contesting.
