GENERAL COMMENTS

The headline read “Solar Storm headed toward Earth may disrupt power. (It should have read ... may disrupt WIQP – ed). The largest solar flare in 5 years is racing towards Earth, threatening to unleash a torrent of charged particles that could ... cause communication problems...” And by golly, it sure did. It probably turned WIQP into a one band event for 2012. CQ Magazine, in their May 2012 issue, page 88, had the headline “ March Huge Solar Flare. “ Their article mentions that this flare was not one but two, with no idea what was going to happen. I think we all know what happened. The 75/80 meter band disappeared, which reduced the potential for double points, as the rules of WIQP allow for repeat contacts per band.

And then there was one – 40M. 40 meters seemed to work quite well. Perhaps the only band that did. I am not sure about 20 meters, as there were Qs on 20, as well as positive comments from participants about 20M, but, for the first time I can remember doing WIQP stats, I do not find any DX entries, which usually come via 20M. Very few DX Qs in the logs too. While I did not do a Q by band count this year, I think it is safe to say that 75/80 meter contacts were the exception and not the norm. 75/80 meters was mainly noise. WIQP has traditionally been a 40M, and then later on towards evening, a 75/80M event. Without 75/80 this year, the scores were lower due to all of the Qs and subsequent multipliers missing on that band. To me, almost like half a contest this year. 75/80 has been a -so called- second “bread and butter” band for WIQP.

I think the best way to show the flare effects is to go thru a number of participant soapbox comments. Comments such as: “ 20M looked good, but so did 40. Nil on 80 from here (NJ). My lowest score in years “ W2UDT; “ It turned out to be a two band QSO party..80 was a mess “ N4PN (GA); “ This year 80M did not have enough activity ... 40M was the band where most ... activity was “ WA9AXQ; The solar flares made propagation challenging ... 80 was non-existent for us, only 5 Qs ... Our score was down 8.1 % from last year “ W9DND/M; “ the bands just seemed to die the last 2 or 3 hours of the test “ W9ET; “ 40 meters was great ... although 80 was horribly noisy “ KC9FFJ; “ When we put on the 80 meter antenna, there were no signals heard and the noise level seemed high, so not much time was spent on 80 ... after the contest we noted it was the band/propagation and not the equipment “ W9HB/M; “ Very much a one band 40M contest “ K9IMM; “ A rough start, especially on 80M “ AB9IO; “ 80M was non-existent “ N9NE/M; “ 80M was very poor “ KB9OWD; “ 80M was terrible “ AF9T; “ Conditions were bad. Those solar flares seemed to do a number on the bands : K9TY/M; “ Heard a few signals on 80 but they could not hear me and I could not get a run going (one contact on 80) “ NE9U/M; “ 75/80 meter conditions poor “ W0JPL (MO); “ And band conditions were not the greatest as everyone has reported “ K0RC (MN); “ Sure missed 80 meters for this. At least 40 was pretty good “ K0TI (MN); “ The solar flares made 80 impossible and that hurt the in-state multiplier count. 80M was essentially a waste land ... how strange compared to past years. I think I might have made 20 Qs on 80M. 40M was ok at times and at other times I thought I had lost my antenna “ W0ZQ/M. Enough said. Flares caused communication problems. WIQP 2012 suffered.

On the other side of the coin, the weather was dandy again. Best comment here was “ the WIQP organizing committee sure has learned how to control the weather. “ I also think other soapbox comments support that conclusion: “ great weather for putting up some dipoles “ - or - “ What a beautiful day to drive thru north central Wisconsin “ – or - “ it was great day for a drive “ – or - “ No complaints about the weather. T-shirt operations all day. “ Personally, when I did my usual weather map check after church, I found the local temps here in Waterford were already in the 60’s, with full sunshine. On the maps, there were showers moving east out of Texas and Oklahoma. But not much else in the whole USA. Pretty dry. Even those showers did not have much intensity, except perhaps near TX, so I thought there might be a bit of noise on 75/80 later on. Certainly not what myself and other participants experienced.

RESULTS

I think the overall comment would be that WIQP 2012 was pretty much of a repeat of 2011, with reduced scores. Not due to the lack of participants, but the lack of one of our “bread and butter “ bands (75/80). I suspect scores would have been much higher if there had been normal activity on 75/80. There were no new records for the second year in a row. Mobile activity was a bit better this year. We did see a couple of new stations try going mobile, apparently enjoying it. I am always glad to see more participants take to the WI highways, as that is what keeps WIQP going each year, in my meager opinion. I honestly believe that WIQP is as popular as it is because of our mobile activity. Soapbox comments reflect that. I encourage others to try going mobile. It is a rush, as Todd, N9NE mentioned last year.

We saw a number of entries in the Beginner category again this year, six within Wisconsin and seven from without. Having a learning category like BEG was apparently the right decision on our part. Hopefully BEG has helped first time contesters gain experience, and even more so, it will encourage them to continue contesting. It is great sport. One of the stations, a lady from Burlington, was a repeat from last year. The rest are new calls that were not listed in the past two years. By the way, before I forget, one of our young contesters is a 9 year old young lady, Tahmara, KC9UJM. Wow – that is really great. I bet her ham dad, ham mom and ham older sister think so too.

I thank all of you beginners for entering. Just a reminder, the Beginner category was created as a two-year category, to get you started. Two years - meaning you can only enter as a Beginner two times, and then you will need to move to a different category. Again this year, I did list them on their own results page. Take time to thank them for their participation.

So how did we do this year? Well, entries are barely up for 2012. 279 entries this year, 275 last year. Of the 279 entries, we had 145 from WI, two more than last year, and 134 out of Wisconsin, also two more than last year.

The electronic logs received this year were 243, less than a half percent greater than our 233 total of last year. Paper logs went down percentage wise too by a smaller amount – 36 this year compared to 42 last year. Both numbers continue to go in the right direction, in my opinion – electronic log entries up and paper log entries down. We accept both. And as an FYI, a good number of the paper logs came printed in chronological order anyways, not hand written, which means those logs “could” be sent to us electronically, rather than printing out on paper and then sending. If we can help in any way to have you do an electronic submission, please let us know. It does not have to be anything fancy. A plain old text file works every time.

COUNTIES AVAILABLE

For the first time in a few years, we had all 72 WI counties on this year. I hope that it is the result of my spending so much time doing the county and mobile summation(s) that I did last year. It looked to me like a number of mobile and a few fixed stations tried to fix that this year. All 50 states and seven Canadian Provinces (AB, BC, NB, NS, ON, QC and SK) were in the logs. No DX logs were received. Just a small comment here about 50 states. I found only one contact a station had with Alaska. No other AKs. While I cannot be sure, he worked AK, so I counted it. But only one Q from all the logs, which is normally not the case with out-of-state contacts – if you see one you will usually find a few more. Not so this year.

The table below compares total contacts and compares number with-in Wisconsin and out over the last three years. I try to do this each year. I think it is interesting data.

Of those 16,056 CW Qs for WQP 2012, Wisconsin stations made 11, 276, with out-of-state stations doing the remaining 4,780 – or said simply, 30 percent of the CW Qs were made by non-WI stations. Of the 21,232 on the phone side, the numbers are 17,657 by WI stations, with 3,575 by out of Wisconsin stations – or 17 percent of the phone Qs were made by non-WI stations. Combining CW and phone Qs, the non-WI stations did just over 22 percent of the total contacts in 2012 WQP (22.4% to be exact). Without data from past years, it is hard to compare. One thing I do note – the number of non-WI Qs is down about 19 percent this year. I believe that a direct effect of not having 75/80 meters really available this year. I think one of the charges of the WQP Committee for next year, in addition to guaranteeing the weather, will be to get 75/80 back to working condition (which may mean we also need to “flare” back solar activity – pun intended).

Next table, comparing in-WI to out-of-WI entries. Nothing really to comment on, as the ratio between in and out entries did not change at all. I am happy though to see the numbers stay steady, even though, deep in my heart, I would like to see more WI stations participate. Per my previous year’s comments, in 2009 when the numbers flipped, I believe that was due to the “Year of the QSO Party” ARRL event.

MOBILE STATIONS

Of the 19 that entered, 14 of them were Single Operator Mobile, 4 of them were Multi Operator Mobile, and one of them was a Multi Operator Multi Transmitter Mobile. Actually there were two Single Operator Technicians included in the 14, as two of the 2 entries in the SOT category went mobile this year. Collectively they put 212 counties in the logs of other stations, while earning 1,288,961.5 total points, having had 6,867 contacts. Thank you so very much for your efforts on our behalf.

Best Wisconsin Single Operator

The 2012 plaque for highest scoring Single Operator in Wisconsin goes to second time winner, Patrick Cain, K0PC, who operated mobile as W9DND again. Pat operated mobile as K0PC in 2008, 2009 and 2010, and never won. He switched to W9DND. Now he has won twice in a row. As you found out last year, Archie, SK in 1995 and the former owner of W9DND, was a top notch CW Wisconsin operator. (Presently, Pat's driver John holds his uncle Archie's former call sign). Not only that, Archie won second place on CW in the 1964 WIQP. A divine connection? I wonder what Archie thinks. No, I did not see any heavenly connection(s) in their log, although having W9DND ring out on CW again in Wisconsin, might be the reason.

Patrick lives in Chanhassen, Minnesota, which is just west of Minneapolis. This year Patrick traveled through 15 of Wisconsin's counties on our behalf, while doing 779 CW contacts, using low power. He worked 24 WI counties, 41 states and 3 Canadian Provinces, for 68 total multipliers. His final score total was 166,416, down from his 181,130 points from last year. Congratulations Patrick. Enjoy your second plaque as much as the first one.

Best Out-of-State Single Operator

The 2012 plaque for the highest scoring Single Operator outside of Wisconsin goes to first time winner Jim Janke, K9DU, who operated using the Lakeland VHF Radio Society call sign KX0A. Jim lives in Lakeland, MN, which is located just across the Mississippi River from Hudson, WI, just south of I-94, where it crosses the river. Jim did 132 CW, and 102 phone contacts, with 66 WI county multipliers, for a total of 36,234 points. Congratulations Jim. Enjoy your plaque.

Wisconsin Club Competition Winner

Our 2012 plaque for the Wisconsin Club Competition goes to the Fond du Lac Amateur Radio Club. This is their tenth win I believe. This year they had 24 operators entering the WI Club Competition, scoring a total of 955,805 points, compared to last year when they had 18 entries scoring 714,531 points. They set the standing Club Competition record of 977,185 points as few years back. Congratulations. Enjoy your plaque.

Single Operator Fixed

The Single Operator Fixed category was won, for the second year in a row, by Ryan Klavekoske, KB9OWD, from Beaver Dam. He made 211 CW Qs and 400 phone Qs with 67 counties, 46 states and 4 Canadian Provinces, for a total score of 144,261 points. Congratulations Ryan.

Single Operator Technician

The Single Operator Technician category was won by Brian Long, KB9LRD. This is Brian's 8th first place win in a row. He always operates as a mobile, in SOT. This year he traveled through 11 counties, making 138 phone Qs, while working 16 counties, and 1 state, for a total score of 8,519. Congratulations to Brian.

Multi Operator Fixed

The Multi Operator Fixed category was won for the second time in a row by the team of N9BIL, NN9K, N9YPN, and N9CDX, using their Green River Valley ARS club call sign of K9WM, an Illinois club, operating from Crawford County, WI. This year they made 263 CW Qs and 66 phone Qs with 62 counties, 40 states and 1 Canadian Province, for a total score of 91,964 points. Congratulations to Timothy Rogerwall, N9BIL, Peter Beedlow, NN9K, Anthony Padavich, N9YPN, and William Halse, N9CDX.

Multi Operator Mobile

The Multi Operator Mobile category was won by the K8IR and KG9GH team, using the NG9T call sign of the Tri-Cities Contest Club, a Michigan club. They made 664 CW contacts with 27 WI counties, 38 states, and 2 Canadian Provinces, while traveling thru 20 WI counties. Total score was 142,964 points. In 2010, Jim, K8IR, won the plaque as the highest scoring WI Single Operator in the SOM category, using the same NG9T call sign. I believe Eric, KG9GH, was his driver. Last year Jim entered the SOM category again, but did not win. (BTW – there is an interesting picture of Eric on QRZ.COM from a tower, 500 feet up. I wonder who took the pix). Anyways, Congrats to Jim Callow, K8IR, and Eric Janssen, KG9GH.

Multi Operator Multi Transmitter Fixed

The Multi Operator Multi Transmitter Fixed category was won this year by W9EAU, the club call sign of the Eau Claire ARC, for the fifth year in a row. Their 9 operators made 390 CW Qs and 323 phone Qs, working 66 counties, 48 states and 4 Canadian Provinces, for a score of 195,231 points. Congrats to Paul Bittner, W0AIH, Mark Seyffer, KB9S, Kirk Dahl, N0KD, David Voss, KB9WPC, Catherine Seyffer, K9KTT, David Hanson, K9QC, Rolf Nestingen, KG0KM, Stephen Fisher, WB9NTO and Troy Faulkner, KB9AZZ.

Multi Operator Multi Transmitter Mobile

The winner in the Multi Operator Multi Transmitter Mobile category was the W9HB and KF9D team from Illinois. W9HB did 663 CW Qs, and 67 phone Qs, working 30 counties, 36 states and 2 Canadian Provinces, for a score of 145,966 points. They put 20 WI counties on the air. They hold our standing record in the Multi Operator Mobile category. Congratulations to Harold Burt, W9HB and Roger Scott, KF9D.

80 EFFECT

For the 25 plus years I have been doing WIQP data work, I do not ever remember one of our two bread and butter bands not being available. I believe we suffered lower scores, in some cases a lot, thus making 2012 WIQP pretty much of a one band event. I hope this will not translate into stations not participating in WIQP in the future.

Nor do I remember a challenge between first and second place ending this close - 24 points. In our out-of-state single operator group, our first place entry did 234 contacts (132 CW, 102 phone) with 66 multipliers. The second place entry did 233 contacts (122 CW, 111 phone) with 68 multipliers. Both as low power entries. Their total score was on 24 points apart. Was it the difference in CW/phone contacts, the multiplier, OR the “80 effect?” My money is on the “80 effect.” And my mention of this is not intended in any shape, manner or form to reflect on either station’s performance. Am I sure this was totally due to the “80 effect?” No, but I bet missing 75/80 was a good part of it.

Talking about close – another observation. Pat, K0PC, had our highest number of CW ONLY contacts – 779. That is a feat. But, be aware that our second place all CW SOM entry, Jeff, W9MSE, finished ONLY 3 contacts behind Pat. 779 and 776. Does that not blow your mind? Two entries, each doing just under 800 Qs, in only 7 total hours of operation, while bouncing around in a vehicle on one of WI highways. That just impresses me beyond measure. When I did mobile, I had to be parked to do CW, to keep the key solid. And better yet, Jeff logs on paper.

CERTIFICATES

We are going to be sending out the winner’s certificates via an email attachment again this year. Please watch for your certificate. If you do not get it, please let us know right away.

Second. The same two individuals won our “Highest Number of Phone Only Contacts” and our “Highest Number of CW Only Contacts” awards again this year. While we do not announce this award, we have been doing it for a lot of years now. BTW – they are KO9LR and K0PC.

Lastly and most excited comment. THREE of our Beginners won their respective section award – W0UAT won Colorado, AB1OD won Connecticut and VA6NJK won for Alberta. WOW. What could be more exciting than that?

Tough conditions being so close. Many of the missed counties were ones I have covered in the past as W0AA/M. I just did not have the time to put together the mobile station again this year. I would have rather been on the WI roads again, but oh well. Enjoyed participating again. Thanks to all the mobiles. Sure wish I could have been one of the mobiles - WA0MHJ

My goal was to chase the mobiles around the band and make 50 Qs. The bands were not in good shape but I managed to connect with a few mobiles (and some fixed stations) between other tasks - K0MPH

My score dropped way down this year even though I decided to run high power (300 watts). I logged 3 more counties but the raw QSO count was 26 less. Loosing last years low power multiplier trimmed a lot of score off the final number too. And band conditions were not the greatest as everyone has reported. I did venture up to 20M and was surprised I could work a few CW stations. Those were nearly ESP contacts. I was successful moving to 160M with one station, but when I tried with a couple of others, there was no signal to be heard - K0RC

Uff da. That was like pulling teeth. Rates and QSO count were about half of what they were last year and the score was less than one-third of what we got last year. This is our third straight year of working mobile in the WiQP. We operated, or should I say tried to operate from 11 counties. We tried to activate the rarer counties. Conditions were tough. We could never get runs going on either 20 or 40 meters so we ended up working about 90% search and pounce. Taty (OA4ABC) says that it seemed like we worked the same 25 stations 4 times each. But Murphy stayed away and it was a great day for a drive. We really enjoyed the beautiful scenery in Ashland, Bayfield, Sawyer, etc. We drove over two hours to get to our starting point but our objective was to work from some of the rarer counties in the northern and western part of the state. I can't begin to count the number of times we were told "Thanks for the new one". So, despite our poor QSO count, we declared this WiQP a resounding success. One improvement which worked out very well was to feed the audio from the transceiver into the car's stereo so the driver could follow along. In the past I had used a single ear bud with in-line volume control, which was less than comfortable after a few hours. And we are hoping the our Honda Fit's rate of 39.8 mpg may win an award in the coveted "Best Mileage by an Internal Combustion Engine" category - NROT

Sure missed 80 meters for this. At least 40 was pretty good. Last year I had 70 Qs on 80. So score down this year. Did get more multipliers however. Had 65 last year. Missed BAR, BUR, KEN, OZA. Was able to get W0ZQ/m on two bands in a few counties. Thanks for digging out my weak signal - K0TI
