WIQP 2016

This year's WIQP enjoyed reasonable propagation conditions and the weather wasn't bad for March. Band conditions seemed typical except that activity dropped off more than usual during the last hour. See the band activity table below. Temperatures were in the 40's with some rain, especially toward the southeast part of the state. With temps well above freezing, driving conditions were good, aside from the usual spring potholes. And there was no big basketball game, so overall it seems to have been a good day to play radio.

County Activation

Logs were received from all but one of our 72 counties, with Green Lake county being the one not heard from. Other logs show two QSOs with a station in Green Lake county, but that station did not submit a log. Check the WIQP website for more detailed info on activity by county.

Activity by Band

Log submissions for 2016 totalled 309, up 8% from last year's 285. Wisconsin stations submitted a larger percentage of logs this year - 159 compared to 138 last year (51% vs 48% last year). Seven of the out-of-state logs were from DX stations.

Submitted logs contained nearly 42000 entries, up from 37000 last year and slightly more than the 41000 we saw in

2014. There was participation from all 50 US states and ten Canadian entities. No new records were set in 2016 but in-state and out-of-state Rookie categories will be added to the All Time Records page on the website.

Category Results

Single Op Rookie (SOR)

This year's highest Rookie score of 52668 was turned in by Bob Hoffman, KQ9J, of Park Falls. Bob did it with 335 Q's, a mix of CW and phone.

The second highest Rookie is Jacob Feltz, K9TVG, of Junction City. Jacob is a high school student and has been a ham since he was 9 years old. He turned in a score of 47802 points on 514 phone QSOs. Great job!

We have not kept a highest Rookie score on the WIQP All Time Records page, but we will start now. Bob's and Jacob's scores are both higher than the highest previous Rookie score since WIQP has had this category.

Fifteen Rookie entries were received from Wisconsin this year, up from ten last year. Fourteen entries were received from outside Wisconsin, up from eleven last year.

The Rookie category, as the name implies, is to encourage newcomers to get involved and join the fun. Entrants do not need to be new hams - just new to WIQP. This category is open to newcomers for two consecutive years and all entrants in this category get a certificate.

Note: Due to an error in results processing, several Rookie entries were not correctly listed in the Results published in September 2016. One of those omitted is the highest scorer in the Rookie category. This section was restated in December.

Single Op Fixed (SOF)

Chad Kurszewski, WE9V, once again took top honors in this category with 195442.5 points, up from 185022 points in 2015. This is Chad's third consecutive year at the top of the SOF category. Congratulations, Chad!

Runner-up in SOF is Clint Sprott, W9AV, who operated from his place near Muscoda, WI. Clint accrued 129566 points for his efforts. Congratulations, Clint.

Great job, guys, and thanks to all 115 of the SOF entries from Wisconsin stations.

Multi-Op Fixed (MOF)

Tim Rogerwall, N9BIL, and his group of ops from Illinois returned to Grant county this year and took top honors in the MOF category again as they did last year. Their group of five ops (N9BIL NN9K N9YPN KD9VT KB0XY) upped their score to 101400 points this year.

The team of Kent Scheuerell, K9ZMU, and his son Scott Scheuerell, N9HDE, also operating from Grant county, came in second with 69660 points.

Both of the above groups are affiliated with the Hidden Valleys ARC. Congratulations, gentlemen, and thanks to you and the other eight MOF entries for your efforts!

Multi-Multi Fixed (MMF)

The Eau Claire ARC, W9EAU, again turned in the highest score in our party - 333000 points on 1277 QSO's. They QSOed 70 of our 72 counties along with all 50 states and 5 Canadian provinces.

Thanks again to Mark Seyffer, KB9S, and this year's crew W0AIH, KB9S, KI0F, K0TG, N0BUI, KB9AZZ, K5GKJ and KG0KM. You guys are essential ingredient of WIQP.

Runner up in this category were Carolyn Kammen, NQ9A, along with N9CK, who scored 191874 points. There are a total of four entries in the category.

Single Op Mobile (SOM)

Jeff Bechner, W9MSE, a perennial mobile participant in WIQP, came out on top of the single-op mobile competition this year with 174089 points. Great job, Jeff, and thanks for your efforts through the years.

Back with a bang after missing last year, John Baumgarten, N0IJ, is the runner-up, with 164703 points on 814 Q's from 18 counties.

W9DND/mobile, operated by Pat Cain, K0PC and driven by John Holman, W9DND, came in third this year with 160725 points on 812 QSO's while visiting 15 counties.

Big thanks to the eleven mobiles that entered the SOM category this year. The effort, skill and personal resources that go into QSO Party mobile operations is truly awesome, and it is greatly appreciated.

Multi-Op Mobile (MOM)

After running single-op last year, Scott Jasper, NE9U, returned to the MOM category with friends Ron Feutz, KK9K, and Art Wysocki, N9BCA, and they reclaimed first place in the MOM category. Their efforts netted them 15 counties and 785 Q's for 196242 points.

Multi-Multi Mobile (MMM)

This year the Fox Cities Radio Technical Society group operating under KD9CSI was the only entry in this category. Larry WB9KMW and sidekicks Lou KC9YYA, Scott KB9YUC, Tom KD9BMD and Rodney KD0EBT visited 12 counties and collected 21088 points for their efforts.

Top Non-Wisconsin Single-Op

This year's out-of-state honors and a plaque again go to Dan Karg, K0TI, of Woodbury, MN for his score of 43884 on 270 Q's. Dan took this category in 2015 with 44622 points and placed fifth in 2014 with 38610 points.

Thanks to all non-Wisconsin participants for coming to our party! Hope you all had fun!

Top QRP Station

This year's QRP honors were taken by Jim Lageson, N0UR, who came over from Minnesota and operated QRP mobile in twelve Wisconsin counties. Jim did 125136 points on 438 Q's. Jim also gets a cert for fourth place in Single-op Mobile category.

Overall, logs were received from 15 stations that operated QRP this year, 11 in Wisconsin, 4 out of state.

Top VHF Station

The Technician categories have been discontinued in favor of a VHF plaque. Hopefully this plaque will provide more incentive for VHF activity going forward.

The top score above 50Mhz was turned in by Robert Buecker, N9HAL, who accumulated 932 points on 32 VHF QSO's. Robert was mobile and visited six counties but had enough Q's for bonus points in one of them.

In all, 42 stations reported VHF/UHF QSO's, but only 14 had five or more. It looks like a lot of HF stations make a few casual VHF Q's that show up in the VHF listing.

For a number of years there was a convoy of mobiles that drove around Lake Winnebago, working each other on multiple VHF/UHF bands as they moved from county to county. With the county bonus, they built up some impressive scores. It would be cool to see a return of this kind of activity.

Club Competition

A new name shows up as the top club this year - the Four Lakes Amateur Radio Club. Nine Madison area stations con-

tributed their scores, adding up to a club aggregate of 564811.5 points. Congratulations to FLARC!

While it's great to see a new name on top of the club competition, the dominance of the Fond du Lac ARC over the last dozen years can't go without special mention. They were on top for the last eight consecutive years and missed only one year since 2003. And, with sadness, we note the passing of Randy, KB9KEG, in 2015. Randy did a lot to promote WIQP within FDLARC for most of these years.

So why is the Society of Midwest Contesters actually first on the club list, ahead of FLARC? It's because club aggregate competition is and has been open to Wisconsin-based clubs only, and SMC, as its name implies, has members all over the upper Midwest. Should this change? It would be appropriate to recognize the regional and non-Wisconsin clubs' contribution and we are open for suggestions on how this might be done.

Please note that aggregate scores for SMC and MWA (Minnesota Wireless Assn) show up in both the in-Wisconsin and out-of-state lists. All together, members of these two organizations scored almost 1.5 million (1484881.5) points in our contest.

A big thanks to all clubs, in and out of Wisconsin, that contribute to the success of our Party by promoting WIQP to your members. Please keep up the good work and let the WIQP committee know what we can do to support your efforts.

A total of 19 mobiles and rovers traveled Wisconsin highways this year, up from 14 last year. At least one mobile visited 63 of our 72 counties and 27 counties had no logs submitted other than by mobile stations, so it's obvious that mobiles are a big part of county activation. Thank you, mobiles!

There are some WIQP entrants that really focus on working as many mobiles in as many counties as possible, some of

them far from Wisconsin. The tables below highlight this activity. The first table is this year's list of the top 12 mobile hunters overall and the second table is the top four DX stations.

Log Submissions

Of the 309 logs received, 16 were paper logs, of which ten were handwritten and six were computer printouts. Of the six computer printed logs, one was received electronically upon request, so a total of 15 had to be entered manually. Although the number of paper logs received gets smaller every year, it still takes a significant effort for us to enter them into our log-check database. If your log is already in a computer, please make the extra effort to get it to us electronically. Any electronic format is almost always better than paper because it avoids time-consuming typing. And please contact us if you need help or directions.
