



# Wisconsin QSO Party

## 2018 Results



### Summary

This year's WIQP encountered band conditions somewhat similar to 2017 with 40 going long early and many participants going to 80 meters by mid-afternoon. Weather was seasonal with no precipitation to interfere with mobile activity.

### WIQP 2018

#### County Activation

Logs were received from 70 of our 72 counties, but there was some activity by local stations in the two "missing" counties, Ashland and Taylor. In recent years John, N0IJ, and his sidekick Terry, W0TVD, made a loop through 18 northwestern counties that included these two, but this year John operated SOF from Douglas so there was less activity in some of these counties.

Over one-third (27) of our 72 counties were activated only by mobiles this year compared to 29 last year. We'd like to see more local stations on the air in many counties. And when they do participate, we'd like to see logs from them.

As in recent years, WIQP county activation data will be published on the website in a few weeks.

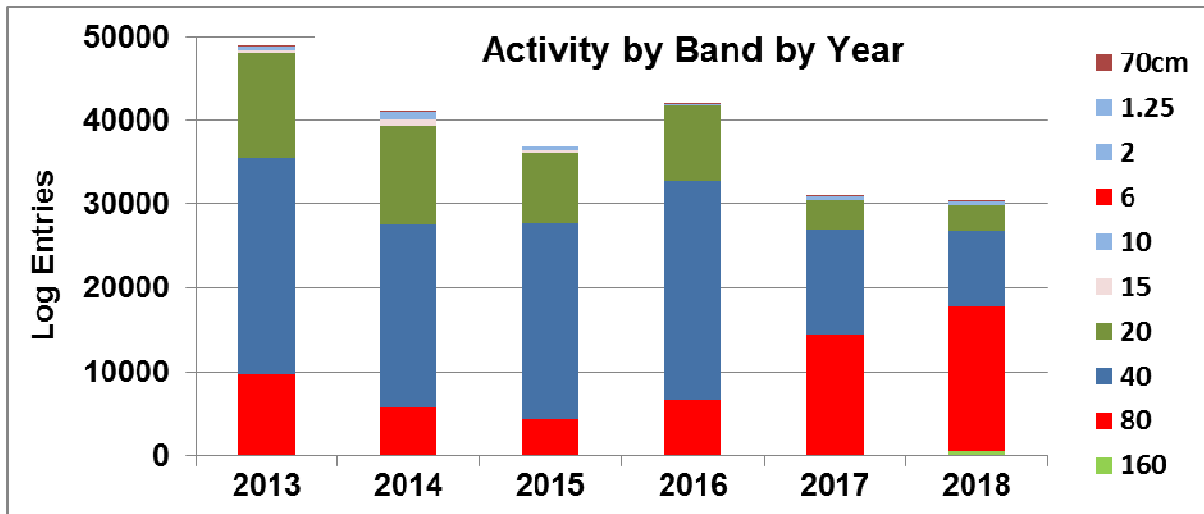
## Activity by Band

Log submissions for 2018 totaled 332, up 3% from last year's 317. Wisconsin stations submitted 160 logs this year compared to 172 from out of state.

Last year, 2017, was different from previous years in that 40 meters went long early and 80 meters picked up a lot of the in-Wisconsin activity. And Q-counts on 20 meters were down by more than 50%, as well. This year that shift was even more extreme. Perhaps we can expect more years like this as we move through the sunspot minimum.

Stations came to 75 meters earlier than usual and activity there made up some of the shortfall on the other bands. And how about that Top Band! Activity on 160 meters increased more than tenfold in 2018, from last year's 44 Q's to 535 in 2018.

The chart below shows how different the last two years have been compared to previous years. The reduced activity on 40 (blue) and 20 (green) and the increased activity on 75 (red) is very evident. The total number of log entries received is also down over 25% from 2016 even though more logs have been submitted.

## Category Results

### Single Op Rookie (SOR)

This year's top Rookie is Joshua Roskos, KC9WWH, of Eau Claire, with 13535.5 points on 156 Q's. The second place Rookie is Mark Swartwout, NX1K, operating as WA9ZDC. Mark operated portable from Ozaukee county and scored 11160 points on 65 CW QSO's.

Thanks to all the Rookies for entering WIQP! We hope you had fun and will be back next year.

Twelve Rookie entries were received from Wisconsin this year, and seven entries were received from outside Wisconsin for a total of 19, down from 22 last year.

The Rookie category, as the name implies, is to encourage newcomers to get involved and join the fun. Entrants do not need to be new hams - just new to WIQP. This category is open to newcomers for two years (must be consecutive) and all entrants in this category get a certificate.

### Single Op Fixed (SOF)

Chad Kurszewski, WE9V, once again take top honors in this category for the fifth consecutive year with 161066 points on 634 total Q's, up from 128350 points last year. Chad is in the southeast corner of the state in Kenosha county. Runner-up in SOF is Todd Fonstad, N9NE, who operated from Amherst in Portage county. Todd accrued 113050 points on 475 Q's for his efforts.

Congratulations Chad and Todd, and thanks to all 122 (up from 109) of the SOF entries from Wisconsin stations.

### Multi-Op Fixed (MOF)

Tim Rogerwall, N9BIL, and his crew from the Green River Valley ARS in Illinois returned to Grant county this year, operating under their K9WM callsign. They again take top honors in the MOF category with 77240 points on 305 Q's and 96 mults. Their group of five includes N9BIL, NN9K, N9YPN, N9MAT and K0NIA. The father/son team of Kent and Scott Scheuerell, K9ZMU and N9HDE, also from Grant county, took second place in the category with 33264 points on 186 QSO's.

Both of these teams are affiliated with the Hidden Valleys ARC in southwestern of Wisconsin.

Congratulations to both of the above groups and thanks to the other five MOF entries for your efforts!

### Multi-Multi Fixed (MMF)

The Eau Claire ARC crew at W9EAU, operating at *The Farm*, are back up over 300,000 points again, scoring 304409 points (234700 last year) on 1293 QSO's for the highest score in our party. Thanks again to Mark Seyffer, KB9S, and this year's crew of K0TG, KI0F, N0BUI, N9DJB, KC9W, KB9AZZ, KB9S, N0KD and K5GKJ.

Second in this category is the team of Carolyn Kammen, NQ9Q, and Steve Franzen, N9CK, from Dane county. They scored 156912.5 points on 608 Q's.

Thanks to these two teams as well as the other three groups in this category!

### Single Op Mobile (SOM)

Pat Cain, K0PC, came over from Minnesota and mobiled through 17 Wisconsin counties, collecting 643 CW QSO's to take the honors in this category with 104675 points. Pat has been a major player for a lot of years, operating with his own call the last two years. Before that, he used W9DND, the callsign of his driver, John Holman, W9DND.

Jon Platt, W0ZQ, came in second with 100176 points on 469 CW Q's.

Big thanks to the seven mobiles that entered the SOM category this year.

### Multi-Op Mobile (MOM)

Jim Callow, K8IR, along with Eric Janssen, KG9GH, take first place with 512 Q's for 115375.5 points. Jim and Eric are perennial mobile participants in WIQP, either as K8IR or NG9T in past years.

Second place goes to Mike Johnson, WO9B, and his crew, Frank Humpal, KA9FZR, and Bill Reed, N9KPH. They mobiled through 11 counties and collected 171 QSO's good for 28007.5 points.

Congratulations, gentlemen, and thanks for your participation in WIQP!

### Multi-Multi Mobile (MMM)

Rolf Krogstad, NR0T and wife Taty, OA4ABC, teamed up under the callsign N9T to visit nine western Wisconsin counties. They accumulated 49740 points on 251 QSO's.

Larry Peterson, WA9TT, and a group operating KD9CSI visited ten counties and scored 13046 points for

second place in this category. Besides Larry, team members were Scott Clausen, KB9YUC, Anne Dirkman, KC9YL and Donna Mendyke, KC9THF.

### Top Non-Wisconsin Single-Op

This year's out-of-state honors and a plaque go to Jim Lageson, N0UR, in Minnesota this year. Jim did it with a QRP station, scoring 27240 points on 132 Q's. And you'll see Jim listed again in the next section since his effort also earned him second place in QRP.

Craig Thompson, K9CT, in Illinois is this year's runner-up with 25190 points on 241 QSO's.

Non-Wisconsin logs this year make up just about half of those received - 165 logs out of a total of 332. Thanks to all non-Wisconsin participants for coming to our party!

### Top QRP Station

This year's QRP honors and a plaque go to Dan Alwin, KE0TT, who roved four Wisconsin counties making 130 QSO's for 28436 points.

For the second consecutive year, second place goes to Jim Lageson, N0UR, who operated from home in Minnesota this year. He received 27240 points on 132 QSO's. Last year, Jim took the plaque operating QRP mobile in Wisconsin.

Overall, logs were received from 15 stations that operated QRP this year, six in Wisconsin, nine out of state.

### Top VHF Station

The top single-op score above 50 Mhz was turned in by William Webb, K9FSE, in Jefferson county, who accumulated 220.5 points on 21 VHF Q's, all on 2 meters. Enjoy your plaque, William!

This year 47 stations reported VHF/UHF QSO's, about the same as last year. But VHF activity is noticeably down with only seven logs reporting more than ten QSO's. Three of these seven are from multi-op stations.

### Club Competition

This year brings a new name to the top of the club aggregate competition, the Waupaca County ARES RACES club. Todd Fonstad, N9NE, and Scott Zastoupil, KX9RT, contributed a total of 175498.5 points to put them on top.

Second places goes to our own West Allis Radio Amateur Club with 165116.5 points contributed by 13 members. Thanks to our fellow club members who chimed in! Close behind in third place is the Hidden Valleys Club with 164180.5 points contributed by seven stations.

Note that, in order to level the playing field, a 2017 rules change no longer allows MMF category stations to be included in club aggregates.

And, again, a big thank you to SMC, MWA and other non-Wisconsin clubs and their members for being a big part of WIQP. Also, thanks to all clubs, in and out of Wisconsin, that contribute to the success of our Party by promoting WIQP to your members. Please continue this good work and let the WIQP committee know what we can do to support your efforts.

### W9FK Bonus

For the second year the West Allis club call, W9FK, was activated as a 100-point bonus station by Chuck Dellis, W9WLX. He made 202 QSO's, 133 of which showed up in submitted logs. Note that the W9FK activity is listed under "West Allis Club - W9FK" in the club aggregate listing and is not included in the West Allis Club score. Thanks to Chuck for being W9FK for a day.

### Log Submissions

We still get a few handwritten logs and we don't want to exclude anyone who wants to log on paper. But please understand that in order to process the WIQP results, *all* the log data must go into our database. This means any information not submitted electronically must be entered manually. If there is anyone in your family or your club who can help make your log electronic, it will be greatly appreciated.

Also, please remember that whatever format you use to submit your log, it must contain all the needed information. For example, we get a few logs from general purpose loggers that lack the necessary county

information. Check the WIQP website or contact us if you have questions about this.

We can't emphasize enough the essential part that mobiles play in WIQP. The effort, skill and personal resources that go into QSO Party mobile operations is truly awesome, and it is greatly appreciated.
